Oxfordshire Past 2006 will be held in the Courtyard Centre, Bicester on June 3rd 2006. The organisers this year are Bicester Local History Society, whose Chairman, Bob Hessian, will open proceedings at 10.00a.m. before Paul Smith, County Archaeologist, gives his annual review of discoveries in Oxfordshire. The full programme for the day is on p. 4.

The cost of the day will be £5, including coffee and tea. Lunch is not included; there are many places in Bicester where lunch may be bought, or you may prefer to bring a packed lunch. A map of Bicester appears on page 3.

More recent discoveries have been chronicled in *Oxoniensia*, volume lxxvii of which contains two major excavation reports and a survey by John Blair, 'Anglo-Saxon Bicester: the Minster and the Town'.

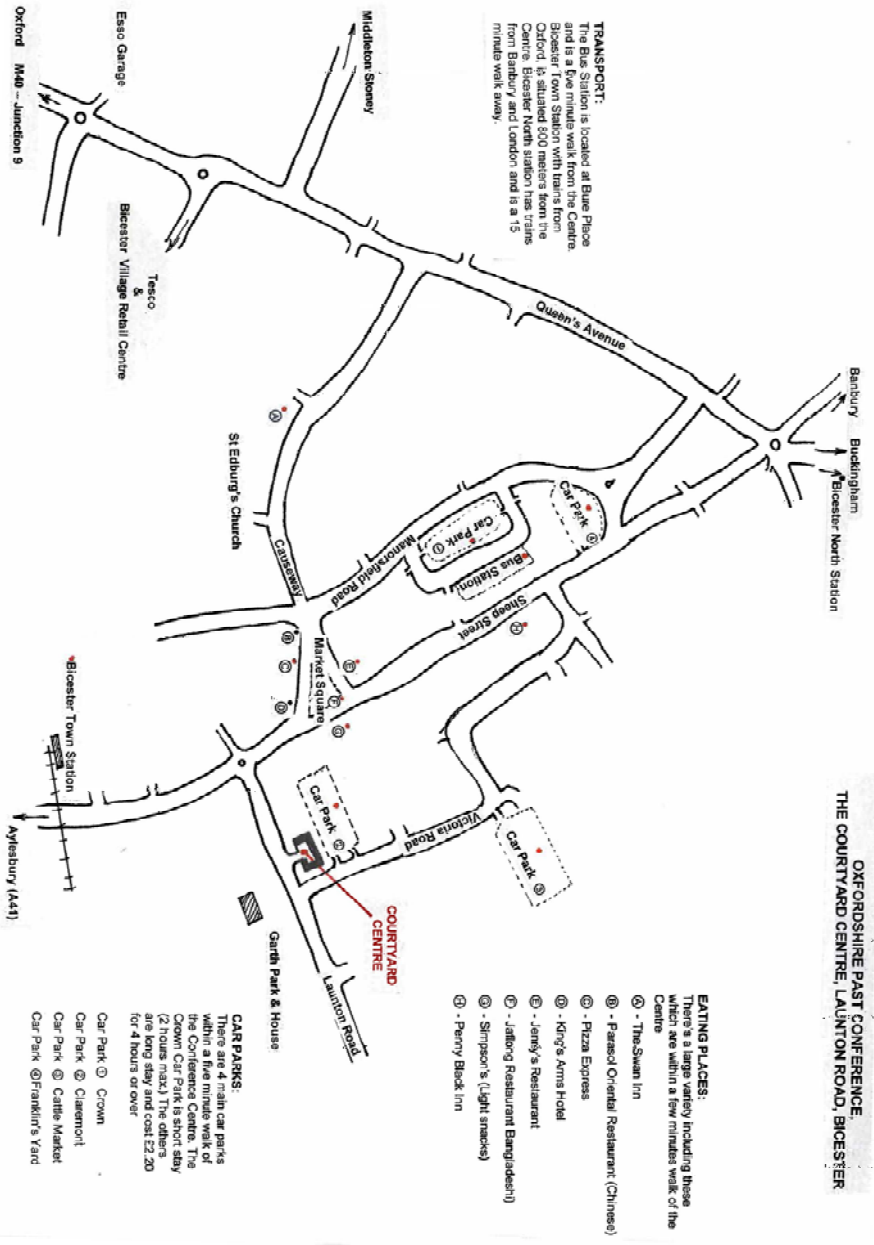
